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Preface:What is an Ion

An **ion** is a charged particle — an atom or molecule carrying an electrical imbalance.

- If it has more electrons than protons, it is negatively charged.

When our charge is scattered outward, we never reach threshold. We touch the barrier but cannot pass. It is like weak sperm reaching the egg: contact without ignition.

But when charge is preserved inward, the threshold is reached. The barrier opens. The scroll unrolls.

The Inward Path

The path of remembering is not about adding more information. It is about conserving potential.

- Silence builds charge.
- Stillness stores it.
- Joy multiplies it.
- Love preserves it.
